## ON A MISSION: AN UPDATE FOR YWCA SUPPORTERS



This month YWCA Missoula is using our newsletter to share our triumphs, successes, and updates on the last fiscal year. We wanted to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support through last year, this year, and the future.

## **Greetings and Gratitude**

As YWCA Missoula celebrates its 110th anniversary, it continues to focus on the current and emerging needs of women and families. Today, the new Meadowlark facility allows the YWCA to serve twice as many women and families with expanded comprehensive support and emergency housing, but challenges remain.

Rising housing costs are putting more families at risk of houselessness, the majority of which are headed by single moms. Women's constitutional right to reproductive choice is under attack, threatening devastating consequences for young women. The pandemic-related economic effects are disproportionately impacting women who are overrepresented in vulnerable occupations or are forced to leave the workforce to provide unpaid care for family members.

The challenges are great, but the YWCA Missoula is prepared. After all, the organization served the Missoula community through two World Wars, the fight for civil rights, and now, two global pandemics. As in the past, a talented and dedicated team of staff and volunteers and the support of countless community members will provide the fuel propelling YWCA Missoula forward in 2022.

### Fiscal Year 2021 in Review!

Our new facility, the Meadowlark, with twice as much space for women, children, and families facing violence and

housing instability, opened in 2021.



230 families accessed emergency, transitional, or long-term housing, and other support services



## 1,468 callers were assisted on our domestic violence crisis line.

Our domestic violence crisis line (406-542-1944 or 800-483-7858) is staffed 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

YWCA Missoula provided **4,429 nights of safe shelter** to adults and children fleeing violence.



# 105 children enjoyed time with their non-custodial parents at Planet Kids.



<u>Planet Kids</u> provides safe, supervised visitation and exchanges to families that have been affected by domestic, sexual and dating violence, and alleged sexual abuse.

## 65 girls and gender-diverse youth took part in GUTS!

Part of our Youth Services Program, GUTS! encourages young people to explore personal values and discover their strengths through wilderness adventures in the summer, as well as through after-school groups and service projects during the academic year.


