ON A MISSION: AN UPDATE FOR YWCA SUPPORTERS



Greetings and Gratitude

Last month's Supreme Court overturning of Roe v. Wade, while anticipated, was still devastating.

As a domestic and sexual violence services provider, we are concerned that the SCOTUS decision will be particularly harmful to the people we serve. Abusive partners use sexual violence and coercion as a tool of power and control, and this can include denying a victim access to birth control. Abortion restrictions may result in more women being unable to terminate unwanted pregnancies, potentially keeping them and their children in contact with violent partners. While intimate partner violence affects everyone, it occurs at disparate rates and with disproportionate impacts for women of color.

We also know that lack of access to abortion has long-term negative consequences for women and families, impacting everything from educational achievement to financial security. Banning or restricting abortion care creates an additional barrier to stability that will fall unfairly to low-income people and those living in poverty.

Abortion is still legal in Montana, although access to care is not equitable, and reproductive rights may be threatened in the next election. Join us in supporting the Women's Health Protection Act, which protects the right to abortion, free from burdensome and often medically unnecessary restrictions. Dental Services Offered to Residents at The Meadowlark

Thanks to a partnership with dental hygienist, Christel Riitano, residents staying in the domestic violence shelter or the Family Housing Center are now able to receive dental services, including routine cleanings, x-rays, and oral assessments, right on site at The Meadowlark. Christel's services are covered 100% through Medicaid, or provided at no cost to residents without insurance. "Oral health is an important part of an individual's overall health, and is easily overlooked," says Christel. "I'm trying to bring awareness and care to those who have limited ability to see a dentist regularly."
