In Carol's words: "These amazing ladies are the sexual assault response advocates who I have the privilege of working with. Our team is on call 24 hours a day to advocate for survivors of sexual assault and do what we can to oppose a culture of victim blaming.



We get together on a regular basis to review our work and transform stories of harm into resiliency, post-traumatic growth and community accountability. We cry together, we lift each other up, we joke, we get angry, and then we remember to create balance by focusing our awareness on the good that people do, stories of help and healing, and the love and beauty that surround us."

Carol plans to use the \$2500 prize money for the advocates to enjoy some self care together (maybe a spa experience!), care packages for survivors, and other tokens of appreciation for YWCA staff.

Support Group for Sexual Assault Survivors

This winter/ spring, in addition to our weekly open support groups for individuals who have experienced all forms of abuse or interpersonal violence, the YWCA will offer a 10-week, closed support group for adults of all genders who are survivors of sexual assault.
