Back to school can be an exciting time of the year, though it also presents new challenges and additional stressors for the families in our programs to navigate. *Which school do your kids attend when you move or lose your housing? How do kids do their homework when you're all staying in one room together in the shelter? Where do you find the resources for back-to-school clothes and supplies, when you don't have resources for housing?*

In collaboration with the school district and other community partners, we support families at The Meadowlark with things like enrolling in school, acquiring needed supplies, and arranging bus transportation. This helps provide security and consistency for the kids and takes a burden off parents.

We've also recognized the need to provide families with additional, wraparound support while they're staying with us. Virtually every resident of The Meadowlark has experienced trauma, and as a result, we have seen an increasing number of children and families dealing with mental health and substance abuse issues. We are thrilled that we were recently awarded a planning grant from the Montana Healthcare Foundation to help us explore how we can expand our behavioral health and case management services to ensure that even our families who have additional challenges and barriers get the support they need to succeed in our programs and move on to a thriving life.

Today we have 31 children at The Meadowlark. They won't be with us very long, but our hope is that their stay here will feel safe and positive, and that their return to school this fall is as seamless as possible. And during this short window of opportunity, YWCA Missoula will work hard to provide the best, needed support for kids and their families, so that this time in their lives can help equip them with the skills and resources to respond to life's challenges and set them up for a brighter future.

As always, so grateful for your company on the long road to justice. This work is impossible without each of you.
