Following the rally, an Indigenous Made Missoula Winter Market will provide an opportunity to support local Indigenous artists and entrepreneurs.

Please join us, here at YWCA Missoula, in acknowledging the importance of Native American Heritage Month, not just as a time of remembrance, but as a call to action to center the needs of the Native American community. Together, we can contribute to a more inclusive and equitable society.

Program Updates

Pathways Domestic Violence Shelter Update

The domestic violence shelter has been increasingly busy, with 22 adults and 18 children currently staying there. Having the shelter this full is very challenging, with communal living and limited space. Our staff and volunteers are doing a great job juggling additional duties and continuing to ensure that survivors in our community have a safe place to go. Thank you to the entire Pathways team!

One family from shelter was recently accepted into the YWCA's Transitional Housing Program, which provides 18 months of housing and support to domestic violence survivors and their children. This program focuses on helping participants build life skills and economic stability, and ultimately transition into permanent housing.

Holidays at the Meadowlark

Exciting holiday preparations are underway at The Meadowlark! Last year, thanks to the incredible generosity of community groups and individuals, we delivered gift baskets to 50 families in our programs.
