ON A MISSION: AN UPDATE FOR YWCA SUPPORTERS



Greetings and Gratitude

One of the most common questions asked of domestic violence survivors is: why did you stay? It's a question asked by law enforcement, judges, family, and friends. Asking why they stay, however, assumes that victims are somehow responsible for the abuse they endured. It also fails to hold perpetrators accountable for their actions.

There are many challenges that prevent domestic violence victims from leaving relationships. Women of color and other marginalized populations often face increased barriers to seeking help. Many of these barriers are exacerbated by long-standing inequities in public policies and social safety nets, including lack of financial resources, lack of adequate childcare, skepticism of social service institutions, lack of trust in law enforcement and the justice system, and lack of access to housing.

YWCA Missoula works hard to overcome every barrier that might prevent survivors from seeking help, healing and thriving in the future. Providing 24-hour crisis response, connecting survivors to the resources they need, and advocating for them through the complex systems they must navigate are just the start.

At YWCA, we know that all violence is not acknowledged or responded to equally and that some victims go unrecognized altogether. That is why we also firmly support legislation and policies that are inclusive of all victims and survivors, particularly survivors of color, those who are immigrants, or who are part of the LGBTQ+ community. You can learn more about YWCA's legislative priorities and take action to end gender-based violence here.

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month, and we encourage you to join us in learning and acting to support survivors and prevent domestic violence in the future: believe survivors, hold perpetrators accountable, and celebrate healthy relationships.

GUTS! Fall Groups



Our <u>GUTS! leadership and empowerment program</u> fall semester action groups have started! Groups are held at Missoula schools, as well as one on-site at The Meadowlark and one that will be starting soon in Arlee.

The first few weeks of the program focus on strengths, mentors and diversity. One activity is called "Cool People Molds," and provides an opportunity for the groups to talk about some influential people in history, and expand the participants' views of who can have power and be a role model. (For the sake of this activity, "cool people" are folks who identify as female, queer, non-binary, two-spirit, etc.) Then the participants think of "cool people" in their own lives and make a sculpture out of playdoh to represent them!
