Program Updates

Grants Boost YWCA Housing Programs

We're proud to announce two recent grants supporting our housing programs. Thanks to a \$91,136 grant from the Montana Department of Commerce, we'll enhance accessibility and safety in the shelters at The Meadowlark through ADA door assist buttons and additional security features. Plus, matching funds from the Cross Charitable Foundation, the Sample Foundation, and MDU Resource Charitable Giving Foundation effectively double this grant.

Additionally, <u>we've been awarded a \$359,418 grant from HUD</u> in partnership with the Montana Continuum of Care Coalition for our Rapid Rehousing Program, aiding families and survivors of domestic violence in securing permanent housing solutions. Together, we're making strides towards ensuring safe housing for all.

Racial Justice Program

Beginning last month, YWCA Missoula is holding monthly comprehensive racial justice training sessions for all staff members. The training encompasses discussions on the origins and effects of systemic oppression, white supremacist culture, and the process of decolonization. We have also recently reinstated our internal racial justice task force, comprised of representatives from each YWCA program and department, to advance racial justice initiatives across the agency. These initiatives are part of our commitment to ongoing training and internal anti-racism work as an organization.
