Dear Friends,

Since stepping into the role of executive director more than two years ago, one question has stayed close to my heart: What does it take to create a community where everyone truly feels like they belong?

Belonging isn't just about being welcomed—it's about being celebrated. It's about knowing you're safe to show up fully as yourself, to speak your truth...and be heard, to be met with dignity and care, and to be seen and appreciated for all that you bring to the table. At YWCA Missoula, that's the kind of space we strive to create every day—for survivors, for families, for our staff and volunteers, and for our partners and the wider community.

Creating belonging takes humility, commitment and courage. It means honestly examining who our services and spaces are built for, who is centered in our work, and where we still have room to grow. It means listening hard and being open to feedback, holding space for healing, honoring different lived experiences, and showing up in solidarity and joy.

This month, we're putting that into practice in many ways. We'll be at the **Missoula Pride** Block Party on June 21—stop by our table and say hello! We're also excited to be creating two new sacred spaces at The Meadowlark, inspired by feedback from Indigenous participants and community partners, for residents to use for spiritual and cultural practices. It's a day of culture, connection, and a powerful reminder of the ongoing fight for equity.

New Spaces for Spiritual and Cultural Practice at The Meadowlark

We're grateful to share that construction is underway on two new sacred structures for residents at the Meadowlark. These standalone spaces will offer private, dedicated areas for Indigenous spiritual and cultural practices—such as smudging, healing, and reflection—as well as space for other residents to engage in spiritual or cultural traditions.

These standalone structures were inspired by feedback from Indigenous residents and community partners who shared how important it is to have space for cultural connection during times of transition and healing.

Deep thanks to the Pride Foundation for funding this project, and to Windermere Real Estate, with support from First Security Bank, for assembling one of the structures on their annual service day.
