

A Letter from Jen Euell, Executive Director

Dear Friends,

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month—a time to recognize the strength and resilience of survivors, honor the work of advocates, and renew our commitment to ending violence in our community.

Last year, our Pathways Domestic Violence Program served more than 1,300 survivors through our crisis line, walk-in counseling, support groups, and emergency shelter. Behind each number is a person whose life has been impacted by abuse—and each story reminds us why this work matters.

While abusers are always responsible for their choices, we know that structural and environmental factors—like early exposure to unhealthy relationships—can increase the likelihood of violence. By providing positive role models and engaging in youth education, we can help prevent abuse before it starts. Programs like GUTS!, which we offer in local schools, and our youth services at the Meadowlark, teach healthy relationships and boundaries, build confidence, and equip young people with the skills to break cycles of violence.

Ending domestic violence takes all of us. It's not just a private issue—it's a community one. Through strong partnerships across sectors, we can address root causes, support survivors more effectively, and expand prevention and response efforts for lasting change.

One of the simplest—and most powerful—ways you can help is by starting a conversation about domestic violence with your loved ones. Breaking the silence around this issue and bringing it into the bright light of day is work for all of us. You can also explore some of our **frequently** asked questions about domestic and sexual violence here.

Together, we can build a safer, stronger, and more supportive Missoula for everyone.

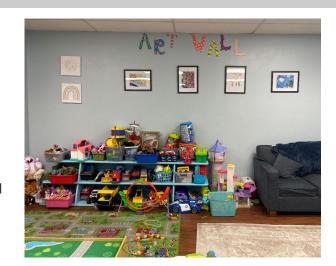

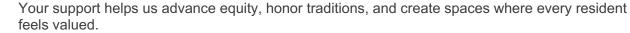
Support Our Sacred Spaces at The Meadowlark
